1820 Roane County, Tennessee Schedule of Manufacturers

transcribed by Ann K. Blomquist

The 1820 Census of Manufacturers is especially helpful for East Tennessee because there is no extant census prior to 1830. Included in the 1820 enumerations were questions relating to the items manufactured, number of persons employed, type of machinery, expenses, and production. The census taker was provided with the list of questions but not a form. So each enumerator recorded the collected information in his own arrangement. This explains why the format varies from county to county. Robert Cannon recorded the Roane County list in legible handwriting which averaged three entries per page. In order to help the reader and to save space, the questions are printed once, followed by individual responses. The answers correspond to the number for each question. Blank answers are omitted from this transcription.

This list includes 37 men in 39 operations with distilling as the most prominent (18). The remaining were: sugar orchards (4), hat making (4) cabinet making (3), tan yards (2) saddlers (2), shoemaking (2), iron works (1), gun making (1) blacksmithing (1), and building supplies (1). Ambrose Jons [Jones] was the largest employer with 4 men while 25 operations employed only one man. Other operations employed men: two men (4), three men (4), unknown but probably only one (5). None of the county manufacturers employed women or children. Two men had two operations. Starling Camp had a distillery and a sugar orchard, Michel Arnold had two distilleries.
