1860 Claiborne County, Tennessee Slave Schedule

Introduction and transcription by Danette Welch

During June 1860, William G. Payne performed an extraordinary act of historical preservation. That summer, as assistant census marshal Payne traveled across the Claiborne County countryside collecting information for the federal census, he made a very simple decision to modify the standard required enumeration. Although the decision added a bit of extra work for him at that time, it also produced a document like very few—if any—of those done by his fellow census takers. Payne recorded the slaves of Claiborne County by their own names as well as those of their owners, and in doing so, he made the almost one thousand items of chattel included on the 1860 Claiborne County Slave Schedule more than just property. He made them people.

The most valuable works of history can often be found in small people making small acts, and William G. Payne may or may not have been conscious the import or the impact of the extra task he undertook. The image the historical record leaves for the enumerator is less detailed, making his motivation for naming the individuals on his slave schedule impossible to guess. Whether Payne was attempting to make a conscious social statement, committing a random act with no thought for its meaning, or merely exhibiting a compulsion to record as much detail as possible is unknown, and his reasons will likely remain a mystery.

The summer he committed his small—albeit revolutionary—act, William G. Payne was a 39 year old Virginia-born farmer living in the Rogersville Post Office area of the Ninth Civil District, Hawkins County, Tennessee. A married man with seven young children and barely one hundred dollars worth of personal property, he owned no real estate. The only boon Payne possessed during that census year may have been the fact that he was literate. He was not even counted as the head of the household. However, the person who occupied that position may hold more significance to the story than all the rest of the available information combined. The head of dwelling number 727 and family number 676 was William Parsons, listed as an age 30, Tennessee-born male with no occupation or known ability to read and write. According to the census schedule, William Parsons was also a mulatto.

William G. Payne had lived in Hawkins County for at least ten years before 1860, but, based on the ages and birthplaces of his children, it may have been even closer to twenty. William, his wife Elizabeth, and three children (James, William, and Margaret Jane) appear on the 1850 Hawkins County Census where William reports possession of real estate valued at a relatively low \$75.00. Early East Tennessee Marriage Records hold several interesting entries for grooms named William G. Payne (to Roday(?) H. Marcum, Claiborne County, 7-23-1845; to Mary Anderson, Hawkins County, 12-16-1847; and to Lethia Whitson, Washington County, 3-30-1854). None of these, however, correspond very neatly to enumerator William G. Payne's wife named Elizabeth or to the age of the eldest child in his household (James, b. ca. 1843). An intriguing marriage for a second Mary Anderson to James W. Payne in Hawkins County on August 15, 1849, further complicates the search.

Around 1868, if his grandson James' birth date and place can be trusted, William G. Payne moved his family to Pattonville Post Office, Powell District, Scott County, Virginia, where they appeared on both the 1870 and 1880 Censuses. Most of the eleven known Payne children remained single and in William's household until well into their thirties, though grandchildren appearing in the home seem to have been born to some of his daughters during this period as well. Ten children lived with William and Elizabeth Payne in 1870, and eight children were still present on the 1880 census with a ninth living next door.

William Parsons proves more difficult to identify. The William Parsons who seems the likeliest known candidate still holds a good number of discrepancies and contradictions, but, presuming William Parsons may have been free and enumerated upon the 1850 census—the combination being a stretch of faith and probability—only two likely suspects appear, William Parsons of Taylor County and William J. Parsons of Lynchburg, Campbell County, Virginia. The 1850 census records both as born and living in Virginia. Having lived out an entire and well-documented life in Lynchburg, Virginia, William J. Parsons can be rather quickly and neatly disqualified.

William Parsons of Taylor County, on the other hand, cannot be quite so easily dismissed or included. A twenty-year-old on the 1850 census, this William appears as the youngest son in the household of seventy-five year old John Parsons and his sixty-year-old wife Elizabeth. John Parsons was listed as an illiterate mulatto, but he was also a farmer who owned real estate valued at one thousand eight hundred dollars. William Parsons of Taylor County appears
