Hours of operation: Monday – Saturday 9 am – 5 pm; Sunday 1 pm – 5 pm

Current admission rates are: \$5/adult, \$4/ senior citizen, \$3/youth (5 – 18), Free for children under 5. Group rates are available for scheduled groups over 20.
