Andrew Johnson National Historic Site and National Cemetery interprets the life and legacy of the 17th President. Andrew Johnson's presidency, 1865-1869, illustrates the United States Constitution at work following President Lincoln's assassination and during attempts to reunify a nation torn by civil war. His presidency shaped the future of the United States and his influences continue today. The site resources include the Andrew Johnson National Cemetery, his historic tailor shop and two of Andrew Johnson's historic homes.

Teachers wishing to bring their class to the Andrew Johnson National Historic Site need to call the visitor center at 423-638-3511. The visitor center staff can help you schedule your reservation. The tours revolve around half-hour increments needed to complete a tour of the President's Homestead, often with 15 added minutes for movement between the Homestead, the Visitor Center, and any other historic area you may visit.

Hours: The National Historic Site is open seven days a week from 9:00 am - 5:00 pm.

Cost: There is no cost for to visit any portion of the site, however a tour of the large Homestead does require a national park staff member to lead your tour

Chaperones: We require one adult minimum for each group of 20 students to ensure safety

of the group and protection of these valuable resources.

Lunch: There are no picnic locations within the National Historic Site. Contact Greeneville's Parks and recreation department for picnic area locations around the town.

Visiting: Park Rangers can often visit local classrooms to provide curriculum based classroom lessons as a pre-site or post-site lesson. Contact the National Historic Site for more information about these in-class programs.
