On August 27, 1956, twelve young people in Clinton, Tennessee walked into history and changed the world. They were the first students to desegregate a state-supported high school in the south. Clinton High School holds the honor of having the first African-American male to graduate from a public high school in the South. It was a great victory for the Civil Rights Movement. The event of that school year and the years that followed are commemorated at the Green McAdoo Cultural Center and Museum. From the collection of the 12 bronze statues as the centerpiece of the museum to the 1950s classroom upon entering, this museum tells a powerful story of the courage of students and adults to make history.
